A burial list could not be located. The first settlers of Northville are buried here starting with John Dennison and Phoebe Elwell in 1804. The cemetery association was organized in 1855, with Joseph Spier as treasurer for 30 years. Prospect Hill on the north end of the village opened next in 1882. Concrete block pillar support the iron gates. The cemeteries east boundary is the Northville Lake (originally Hunters Creek).
