Narrative Description of Property: The 1.5 story wood framed building is built in the Arts & Crafts (Bungalow style). The first floor front window is a group of three 6/1 wood double hung windows. It has a single, center, shed dormer with three 6/1 wood double hung windows. It has two tapered columns supported by brick/masonry bases on the front full porch. The clapboard is wood painted grey. There are custom wood shutters painted red. The trim is wood painted cream and yellow. The lot is a typical village lot with an adjacent extra lot to the north. The yards are free of any significant features. This building retains its integrity.

Significance: The criteria of eligibility are associated to Criterion A & C (Properties significant for its association in or linkage to events, and architecture/artistic value) for its significance to the history of Northampton at the last stage of its significant era. This building is a typical bungalow style very common to 1930 but this example is the one of few in the village and also retains its integrity. It is similar to a Sear Roebuck home that could have been ordered with plans and materials.

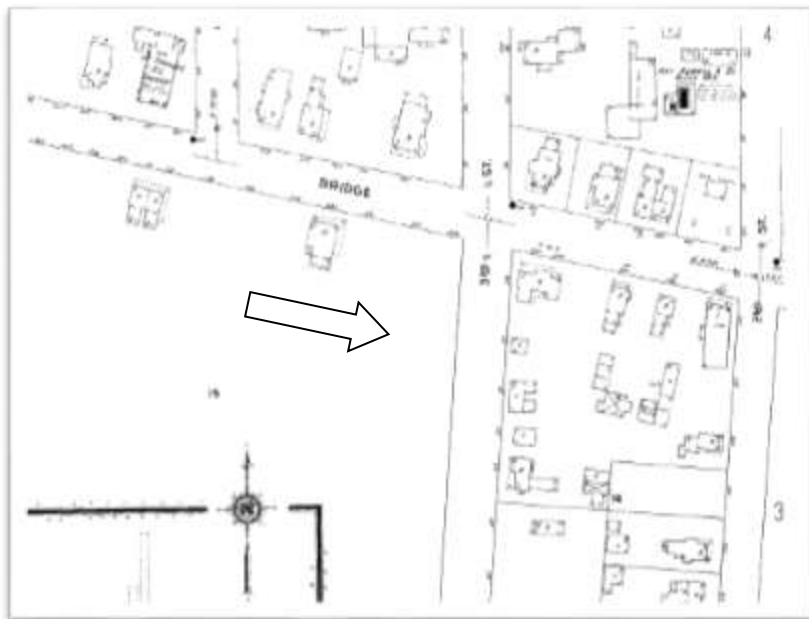

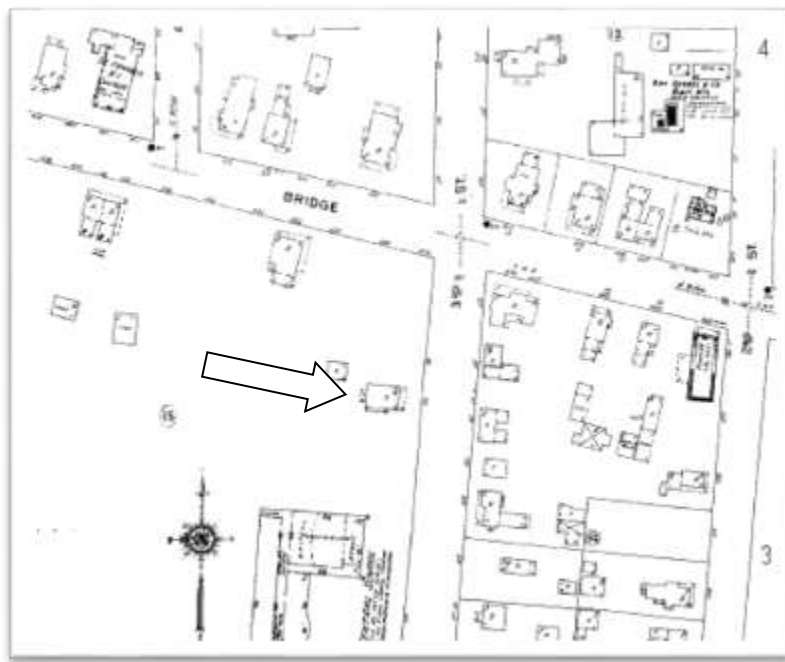
