## **Narrative Description of Property:**

This 1 ½ story wood framed home is built in the Folk Victorian style. The façade is front gabled roof with an intersecting wing on the east. The façade gable has steep sloped roof, 2 window bay on the first floor and a single window on the second floor. The windows are 6/6 dbl hung wood. The wing has eyebrow windows. The interior door trim molding is exaggerated and large with rosettes. The entry is on a small porch in the center of the east wing.

<u>Significance:</u> The criteria of eligibility are associated to Criterion A & C(Properties significant for their association in or linkage to events and architecture/artistic value) for its significance to the history of the Village of Northville, important because of its association to John Barker who was a dealer in fruit, fish, oysters, and newspapers (Bennis), and is an excellent example of an Folk Victorian home in the village. There is not another house like this one in the town of Northampton.






1890 Burleigh Lithograph – shows house from rear




Interior door molding


