Narrative Description of Property:

This 2 story masonry building is built in the Victorian Style. The façade is a typical store front with a flat roof. There is a decorative cornice with molding and brackets. The second story has two bay windows stylistic of Italianate (identical) each with three 1/1 dbl hung wood. The first floor store front windows have been altered. There are two store fronts each having their own recessed entry and window. The the left (north) side of the façade is the entry stairs to the second floor.

Significance: The criteria of eligibility are associated to Criterion A & C (Properties significant for their association in or linkage to events and architecture/artistic value) for its significance to the history of Northville, important because of its association to the establishment Main Street business and providing goods/services to the village of Northville and is an excellent example of Victoria in the village.

Dr. Franklin Wright built this brick building after the previous building at this site burned in 1890. Dr. Wright’s office and apartment were on the second floor. The first floor was divided down the middle into two stores. Some of the businesses that were there were Wm. Kested’s Drug store in the north side and Frank Kested’s Harness Shop in the south side. A number of other businesses have occupied this building: Franklin Wright Jr. Drug Store, Northville Cash Store, A & P Store, Cohen’s Dry Goods, Wm. Lyke’s, Grand Union, Sugar Bowl/Tuccio’s, Homer Dodge Department Store. At present (2009) on the N. side is the Video store and on the south side, Sacandaga Properties Real Estate. This property would benefit from mixed zoning (commercial and residential).

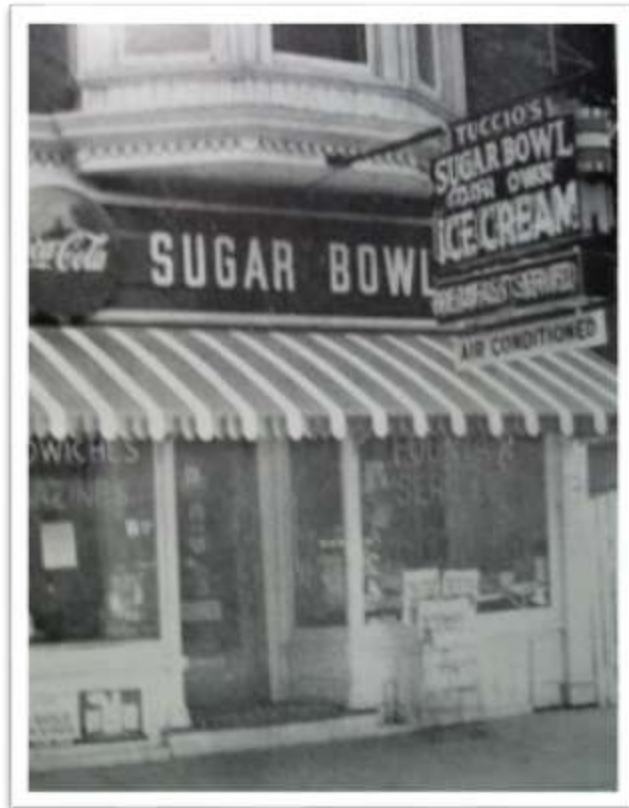

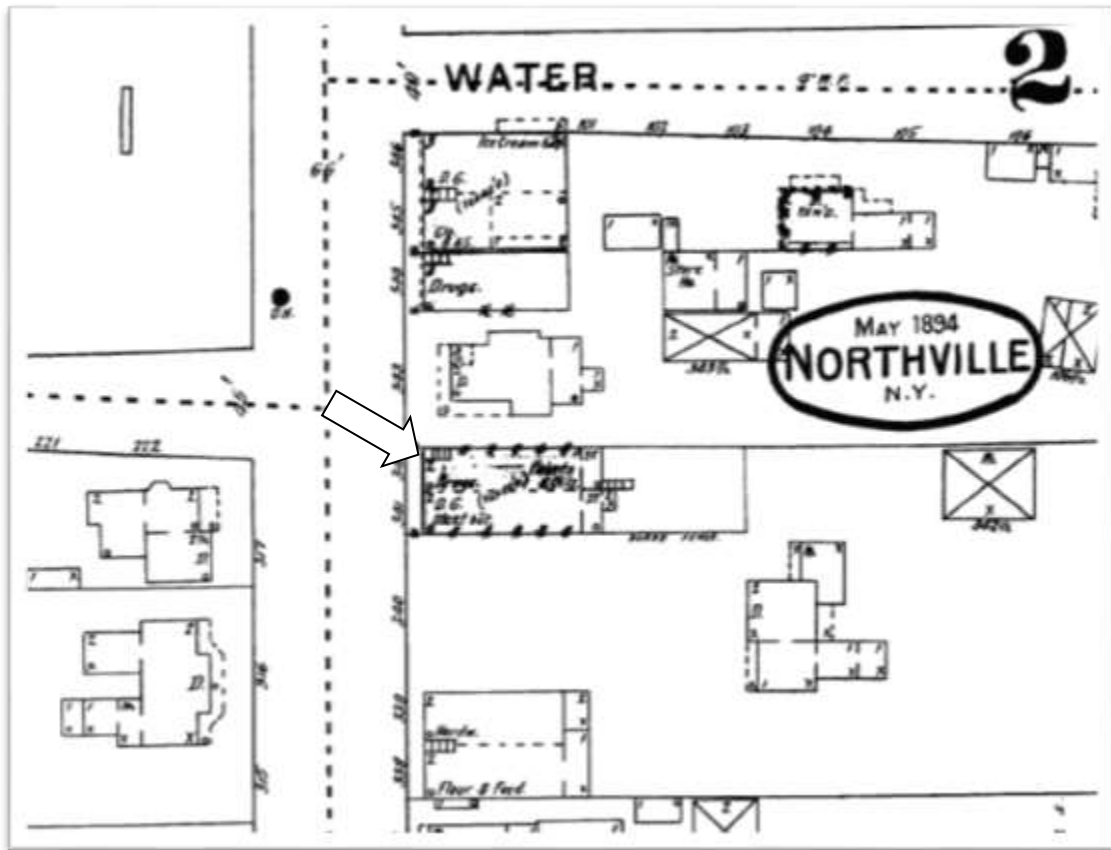

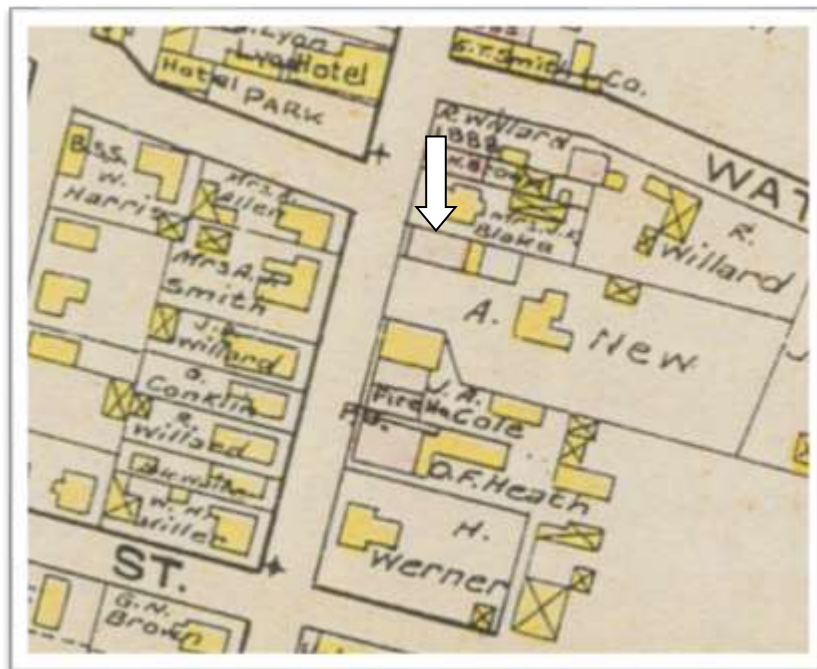
