Narrative Description of Property:

This 2 ½ story wood framed home is built in the Neoclassical style. The façade is front gabled roof with a full height entry porch. The entry door has side lights and transoms with a balcony overhead. The porch columns are round fluted here is dentil molding detailing

Significance: The criteria of eligibility are associated to Criterion A, B & C (Properties significant for their association in or linkage to events and architecture/artistic value) for its significance to the history of the Village of Northville, important because of the builder being John A. Willard, and is a excellent example of Neoclassic style with a uncommon subtype (front gabled) with few modifications. John A. Willard built this house for his son Harold.






